Originally conceived to provide the City of Lethbridge with economic development services "by way of a more regional, independent and community-based partnership model," we continue to adapt to the needs of our community and proactively tackle the biggest challenges to support the continued growth and diversification of our region.

Over the last two decades, we have nurtured an entrepreneurial ecosystem that has contributed more than \$205 million to GDP and the creation of 1,480 full-time equivalent jobs. In addition, we have supported, with our regional partners, investment in the increasingly important renewable energy sector worth tens of billions with much more in the pipeline. Direct investment in the City of Lethbridge as a result of our work has exceeded \$2 billion. The work we do matters.

OUR PRIORITIES

Business Retention & Expansion

Workforce – Attracting and retaining talent will be the key barrier to local business expansion. Supporting both the Rural Entrepreneur Stream as well as the Rural Renewal Stream to attract new Talent to Lethbridge.

Supply Chain Identification / Import Replacement – Working with SouthGrow, identify import replacement or "buy local" opportunities with 200 of the region's largest manufacturers.

Reducing Barriers to Growth – Leveraging the Annual Brighter Together Business Survey, identify and develop strategies to reduce barriers to business.

Access to Capital - Improve capital interest in and availability in Lethbridge.

Investment Attraction

Canada's Premier Food Corridor – Lead the cluster ignition strategy leveraging federal and provincial funding to increase value added processing in the region.

Canada's Western Gateway – Lead the cluster ignition strategy leveraging federal and provincial funding to increase investment in the transportation, warehousing and logistics sector.

Southern Alberta Investment and Trade Initiative – Working with our regional partners, facilitate foreign direct investment (FDI) and work with Invest Alberta and the Federal Trade Commissioner Service/Invest In Canada to elevate Lethbridge's profile in international markets.

Advanced Manufacturing – Build on our existing niche and specialty manufacturers to attract new manufacturing investments with automation solutions.

Renewables – Leverage our region's existing strength in wind and solar generation to attract new service providers, site developers and innovators.

Intelligence & Advisory

Market Intelligence Reports – Collect, analyze and present key economic indicators for use by the community to help inform proactive decision making.

Labour Demand Tool – Provide the digital tools necessary to support workforce attraction and workforce development activities.

Commercial Real Estate Statistics – Collect, analyze and present commercial real estate statistics for use by stakeholders to help inform proactive decision making.

Market Data Automation & Visualization – Continually improve the presentation and accessibility of the data and information we provide. Leveraging digital tools to automate collection, reporting and visualization processes.

Energy Management Program – Working with Energy Associates International, provide energy procurement solutions to reduce the costs of utilities for larger commercial and industrial clients.

Insights Discovery – Provide leadership development and team communication training to community clients to enhance their organizational performance.

Virtual Incubator – Support the delivery of programs and services to entrepreneurs both in person at Tecconnect and virtually across southern Alberta.

RINSA -Facilitate programs and services acting as the fiscal agent for the Regional Innovation Network of Southern Alberta.

ElevateIP – As a collaborative partner with Innovate Calgary and the University of Calgary, support the development and deployment of intellectual property programming for entrepreneurs across Alberta from IP awareness to strategy development through to implementation.

Investor Networks – Increasing regional capacity of local investors through training and coaching to provide additional funding opportunities for start-ups.

Community Brand / Reputation Management – Leverage the Brighter Together Community Brand to proactively promote Lethbridge to improve the City's profile.

Team Lethbridge – Working with participating organizations, enhance government relations and build on our positive reputation with the Government of Alberta.

Digital Content / Website Platform – Building a new website platform to modernize the user experience while at the same time future proof our site for future applications.

Signature Events – Host exceptional live educational and networking events that bring the business community together in a way that no other organization can accomplish.

Publications – Produce reports and other documents that add value to decision makers and inform prospective investors.

Intake Processes - Simplify and automate our client intake processes.



OUR POTENTIAL CHALLENGES

Recovery from the COVID19 global pandemic continues with Lethbridge enjoying the benefits of a reasonably diversified economy. Elevated prices for agricultural commodities and our manufacturing exports suggest a foundation of continued strength upon which to build. Four key challenges to our economy will be the main areas of focus for the organization over the next business plan including:

INFLATION

Input costs for businesses including labour have the potential to constrain growth.

INTEREST RATES

Are expected to gradually decline over the course of the business plan but are likely to increase the cost of capital in the first few years and may impact both business expansion and residential housing.

GLOBAL CONFLICT

Geopolitical instability in Europe due to Russia's invasion of Ukraine will continue to dominate global affairs but risk in Asia and with Canada's other trade partners will require monitoring.

LABOUR

The availability of talent is a challenge for business with low unemployment, failure to either attract or retain talent and align skills with industry needs will create a drag on the economy.
